What is a Precinct? And why does it matter?

Johnston County is often thought of as *hopelessly* Republican. But ... *is it really*? Here are the numbers on the Johnston County Board of Elections website¹:

Registered Voters as of: 12/23/2019 Republican: 49,753 Democrat: 37,676 Libertarian: 822 Green: 24 Constitution: 84 Una: 41,491 Total: 129,848

The difference between registered Democrats and registered Republicans really isn't all that much. But here's the exciting part. Take a look at that last figure - there are more than 41,000 voters in Johnston County registered as "Unaffiliated." We **can** turn Johnston County blue - but <u>only if we educate voters</u> on who our candidates are, what they stand for, and why they're the best leaders to bring our residents roaring into the 2020's.... and get voters to the polls.

So ... how are we going to connect with JoCo voters? Have you seen a map of our County? It's huuuuuuge. Here's the answer - the easiest way to reach voters county-wide is through active precincts. But, what is a precinct, anyway? How do I know which one I'm in? And who do I contact to get involved?

Your attendance is NEEDED at your Precinct Organizing Meeting!



Think about the place you go to cast your vote on Election Day - that's the polling place for your precinct. Everyone who votes at that location lives in your precinct. Your precinct is as "local" as it gets - it's you and your neighbors, working together to advocate for shared beliefs and progress. It's the backbone of our grassroots political organization, and the easiest way to get involved and truly make an impact in the election is actually probably the easiest - getting involved with your local precinct. Nobody knows your neighborhood better than you.

Precinct Organizing Meetings are held each spring. A few important things happen at these meetings - first, the precinct is identified as "organized" with the North Carolina Democratic Party (NCDP), which helps allocate resources to aid in our *Get Out the Vote* efforts. Officers are elected to help coordinate outreach in that precinct. And finally, delegates are named for the District and County conventions, which eventually lead to selecting the delegates who will represent us at the State Convention and even the biggest political event of the year - the Democratic National Convention.

A precinct will be considered "organized" with the NCDP if 5 registered Democrats who live in that precinct attend the annual Precinct Meeting. That's all we need - 5 attendees. Yet many of our 36 precincts struggle each year to get even 5 people to attend. *Please, we need you to attend this meeting.*

** Our Precinct Organizing Meetings will be held the week of February 9-15, with the majority of precincts meeting on Saturday, February 15. As time and location for each precinct are confirmed, details will be posted online, so pop by our website for more information. Not sure which precinct you're in? Visit our website and click on the "Registration Lookup" link. Search for yourself, and your voter registration info will display which precinct you're registered in.
