
Next up: Pet Photo Contest

#### **Message From the President**

As was noted in the previous update about the DWNC State Convention, Sarah Anderson, Past President of the DWNC and DWJC, was. honored as the DWNC 2021 Woman of the Year. We acknowledge her many contributions to the Democratic Women as well as the Democratic Party. Thank you Sarah for all that you have done and all that you continue to do! I also personally want to congratulate each of our STARS award winners for the work and dedication displayed by each on a daily basis! We appreciate each of you and could not do what we do without you!

Here is Sarah's message as she speaks to the importance that women have and the difference that women make in every election!

#### **Women Make the Difference**

In 1960 Terry Sanford ran for the NC governor's office. He realized the value of involving women in his campaign. County to county women formed groups to get out the vote for Terry Sanford and other Democrats up and down the ballot. Of course he was successful in winning the governor's office – and why not? Women make the difference. In 1961 these women's groups formed county Democratic Women's chapters along with the state organization of the Democratic Women of North Carolina (DWNC). The president of the DWNC served as the first vice–chair of the North Carolina Democratic Party (NCDP) until Betty Ray McCain became the first woman to chair the NCDP in 1976.

I share all of this history to say today, 60 plus years later, <u>women are still making the difference</u> in electing Democrats up and down the ticket. A lifelong yellow dog Democrat, my experience in the organized Democratic Party started in 2005 with the Democratic Women of Johnston County (DWJC) and expanded in 2006 with my election to the DWNC executive board. I have continued to serve the DWJC, the DWNC, the JCDP, and the NCDP to present, and everyday I see women leading the way to make a difference in our communities, our counties, and our state. In Johnston County, from Middlesex to Meadow, from Cleveland to Princeton, the DWJC members are building relationships, doing community service, and working on behalf of Democrats. In North Carolina, from Murphy to Manteo, Roanoke Rapids to Whiteville, women across the state are doing remarkable things, living our Democratic values and making a difference.

I challenge every member of the DWJC, members of any other affiliated group, all precinct members to broaden our reach. In a red county like Johnston we are committed to the long term effort to elect more and more Democrats for local office which will happen over time. Right now we can make a HUGE difference for those who are running in statewide races. If we increase our Democratic turnout by just 1% per precinct we can help elect good strong Democrats like Cheri Beasley for US Senate, Lucy Inman for NC Supreme Court, and all the rest who are running for statewide offices.

How does the DWJC do that? We support the Democratic Party's GOTV Building Blue 2022 effort by strategically reaching out to Democratic women who are infrequent voters to build a relationship with them to ensure they go to the polls. It is using all our tools in our toolbox: the Power of the Pen, phone banking, knocking doors, working for candidates, volunteering at the polls, and continuing to be visible in the community. Sixty two years ago, it was women who made the difference for North Carolina, together we can do the same in 2022 and 2024.
